The next thing I knew I was being woken by two firefighters dressed in gold uniforms and breathing masks. I started to cough a lot and my eyes were stinging. The lounge room was full of grey smoke. The firefighters helped us to escape out the front door to the fresh air. I was feeling really bad. They put oxygen masks on us. I started to feel much better.

Another firefighter was opening all the windows and doors in our unit. Smoke was coming out everywhere. The firefighters used a ladder to climb on the roof.

Our neighbour had rung 000 (Triple Zero) and called the fire brigade. The smoke alarm in our unit had a flat battery and didn't work. If the smoke alarm had activated it would have woken us very quickly. I had been silly leaving the kitchen and falling asleep while something was cooking. Kareem and I were very lucky to survive this fire.

When the ambulance paramedics arrived, I took them to grandfather. They treated him and then took him to hospital in the ambulance. My father went in the ambulance too.
